Mothing in Montgomeryshire – 2024 Annual Report

New Species Recorded in Montgomeryshire During 2024

In general, 2024 was quite a poor year for moths, with many recorders getting low numbers in their traps, or out doing field work. The species count and quantities were also down across the whole of the UK. However, conversely 2024 was a much better year than last year for New County Records (NCR's), with three macro and six micro species added to our county lists, so the year wasn't a total washout!

The details of the 6 new micro species recorded are: Old bf log number in brackets: -

17.013 (0463) Ypsolopha vittella, 11/08/2024 at Llandyssil recorded by MEG. This is a local species found feeding on elm and beech in woodland throughout much of the UK. It is an NCR for Montgomeryshire and also only the seventh record for north Wales.

38.045 (0629) Elachista utonella, 26/06/2024 at Cemmaes recorded by SAL. This sedge mining species, found local across the UK is an NCR for Montgomeryshire and also the first record for north Wales. Gen det carried out by ANG.

28.024 (0656) Tachystola acroxantha, 21/09/2024 at Newtown recorded by PMG. This species (thought to have originated from Australia) has been slowly advancing through the southern half of the UK and it was only a matter of time before it reached Montgomeryshire.

35.161 (0755) Stenolechia gemmella, 26/08/2024 at Guilsfield recorded by SOS. A very good record for North Wales (only 12 previously) and a first for Montgomeryshire.

63.054 (1409a) Cydalima perspectalis, 30/07/2024 recorded by PMG. Well, its finally arrived in Montgomeryshire, Cydalima perspectalis the Box-tree moth, and generally regarded pest species, was accidentally introduced to the UK, originating from south-east Asia. The larvae feed on various species of box Buxus spp. The moth was spotted at Llanymynech in the far north-east of the county.

62.057 (1485) Phycitodes maritima, 09/07/2024 recorded by SAL. A local species in the UK, recorded at Cemmaes Road in the far west of the county. Gen det carried out by ANG.

The details of the 3 new macro species recorded are: Old bf log number in brackets: -

70.012 (1711) Treble Brown Spot Idaea trigeminata, 25/06/2024 recorded by MEG. This species is slowly spreading from the south-east of Britain, it is only the 9th record for North Wales.

73.330 (2102a) Radford's Flame shoulder Ochropleura leucogaster, 24/10/2024 recorded by SS. A migrant species recorded from many parts of the UK during an influx from the near continent in late October 2024. This moth was recorded in the north of Montgomeryshire.

73.104 (2392a) Porter's Rustic Athetis hospes, 07/09/2024 recorded by GD. This excellent migrant species was recorded near Llanidloes in August. It is usually found along the southern and south-eastern coastal counties of England, so it was a huge surprise to see it turn up in Montgomeryshire, it is also a first for North Wales.

End of Year Statistics for 2024

Summary of end of year statistics; figures in parenthesis show 2023 totals.

• The number of macro records for 2024 were up by about 600 on the previous year, while micro records were just slightly up over the previous year.

• The breakdown is: - we added a total of 13,614 (13,124) of records to our database. The share between macro and micro records was; 11,717 (11,136) macro and 1,924 (1,988) micros. We now have 296,961 (285,244) macro records and 4,584 (46,660) micro records, giving us a grand total of 331,904 (345,545) records in the database.

• Total number of species now held in our database is 546 (543) macro species and 685 (679) micro species giving us a total of 1231 species recorded in the county.

• Total species recorded in 2024 was 393 (398) macro species, 5 species down on 2023, but still very good and 256 (222) micro species, 34 species up on 2023, which is going in the right direction. Giving a grand total of 649 (620) species for the year – an overall rise of 29 species on the previous year, which is excellent.

The following charts show the 2024 rank of the top five species in various categories recorded in Montgomeryshire.

<u>Please note</u> the previous year's rank/records are shown in parenthesis and a dash indicates that the species was not in top five the previous year. As usual I have separated the macro (left hand charts) from the micro moths (right hand charts) so that you get a better overview of how both groups are doing.

The two charts below show the top five most numerous species 'by records' for the year.

In the macro moths the Brimstone Moth has stayed on top spot. The Large Yellow Underwing has moved up to 2nd from 4th place and the Common Marbled Carpet moved into 4th place. Again, none of the spring species did well in this category.

In the micros the top five species were all once again *Pyralidae,* with *Anania hortulata* holding onto the top spot. There were three new entries: *Patana ruralis* in at 2nd place; *Hofmannophila pseudospretella* in at 4th place and *Eudonia mercurella* in at number 5.

The next two charts show the top five species by the 'quantities' recorded.

Quantities recorded for the macro moths were rather mixed again when viewed against 2023 figures, with a lot of movement in the top five. Large Yellow Underwing moved up to 1st place and the Brown Silver-line moved into 2nd place, the latter not being in the top five at all the previous year.

The most notable figure in the micro species by quantity recorded was with *Chrysoteuchia culmella* collapsing from a count of 1890 in 2023 to 170 last year, it was a very poor year for some species of grass moth. Moving into the top five places were *Eudonia lacustrata* into 4th and *Cydia splendana* into 4th place.
